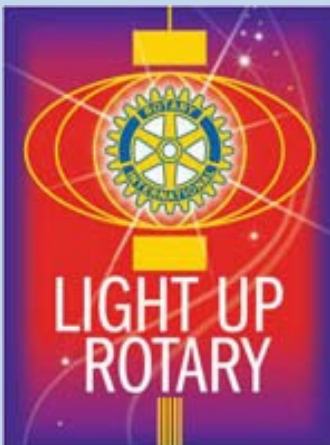
Thank you for all that you have already done for your club and district! And, just know that I am here to help you have one of the best clubs in Rotary. We are a TEAM: work -

KEN'S KORNER – DG's Been Thinking Again: Into the Final Turn

February, 2014. Where have the past year gone? It seems like just a few weeks ago that we were planning for PETS and SETS, 2013 when I would be meeting the incoming Rotary Club President Elects (PE) and Secretary Elects (SE), many of them for the first time. At that gathering I issued two challenges to the PEs:

- 1) **ENGAGE ROTARY, CHANGE LIVES**, and
- 2) 2) Join the **FIRST CLASS** of Rotary District Governors world-wide who all given something to The Rotary Foundation(TRF).

Then the 2013-14 Rotary Year was off to a fast start with the International Conference in Lisbon, Portugal and I returned home and began meeting District 6080 Rotarians on their home turf at local club meetings, at the October District Conference at The Lodge of Four Seasons and then again at our Foundation Gala in November.

We introduced our District project of "Breathing Life Into Georgian Babies" with Rotarian Trish Blair leading the project with her infectious enthusiasm and tireless spirit. We have sent two Rotary Global Scholars on their way, Chris Clark to study at Cambridge University and Maddie Callis at Catholic University in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.

Nearly every one of our current Rotary Club Presidents has stepped up to the challenge and has given to TRF since PETS and SETS 2013. We want to announce at the 2014 PETS and SETS that 100% of our District 6080 presidents and 100% of our clubs have become the **FIRST CLASS** by giving to TRF this year.

We are well on way to reaching our District 6080 giving goal on to The Rotary Foundation. This is such an important goal because it will ensure that a future Rotary

District Governors will have adequate funds available to continue District and Global Grants, will have funds available to send Rotary Scholars to study to improve the lives of the less fortunate, will have funds to continue or Rotary Youth Exchange Programs, and will have funds to continue to "Do Good In The World".

January saw us complete a commitment our district made to members of our Rotary Family in Panama. A team of four District 6080 Rotarians lead by Jim Weiberg and with Mark Naeger, Terry Furstenau, and Mike Powers traveled to Panama to help distribute and install water filtration units and distribute PETS (all terrain personal transportation equipment) to handicapped individuals. The Panama Project was started under PDG Rita Esterly and continued under the leadership of PDG Mark Pearce.

We are now just a few short weeks away from the 2014 PETS and SETS with the Show Me Rotary multi-district committee hard work putting the final plans in place for the beginning of the next Rotary Year when we will **Light Up Rotary**. District Rotary Clubs have all been busy working and planning to do improve life both in their own communities and around the world. I am so proud the efforts of each and every Rotarian who is committed to Service Above Self. Keep up the mission of Doing Good in the World.

As we are coming into the final turn to begin the last leg or fourth quarter of the 2013-14 Rotary Year, a major deadline is right in front of us. March 31, 2014 all Rotary, Rotaract, and Interact clubs must have their forms submitted the District Governor to be considered for achieving the Presidential Citation.

District Governors then have only two weeks to report the

names of those clubs that have earned the Presidential Citation to Rotary International. Do Not let March go by without completing your reports to me.

Joint Rotary Project in Panama

Four Rotarians from District 6080 return from a week long participation in the District 6080 service project with the Rotarians from District 6040 in Panama.

15 water purification systems were installed in a community center (school) in the small village of Chumicosa, Panama which is in the mountainous region of Panama. These systems were purchased and shipped with the help of Rotarians of our District. Until this project was undertaken there was no potable water available in this village.

The Rotarians from the two districts were joined by the Rotaract club of Panama City for this project. The District Governor of 4240 met with the visiting Rotarians and encouraged further cooperation between 6080 and 4240.

The Rotarians also met with the US ambassador to Panama who endorsed our efforts at humanitarian aid to the needy of Panama. Time was also spent with the National Guard leadership stationed at the embassy who had a huge hand in the formation of the partnership between the two Rotary Districts.

The Rotarians of Panama embraced the visiting team with warmth, friendship and hospitality. To the Rotarians of District of 4240 we say thank you. Those who were on the team from our district were Terry Furstenau, Mark Naeger, Michael Powers and Jim Wieberg. The team from our District says to our fellow Rotarians "Thank You for allowing us to represent you to the people of Panama."

Low Receives Paul Harris Fellow from Rotary

The Rotary Club of Pulaski County honored David Lowe – the immediate past president – with the Paul Harris Fellow award during its eighth annual Paul Harris Fellow Banquet on Jan. 28.

“Our club impacts our community in many ways and we set the standard for youth service,” Lowe told the audience just after receiving the award. “It is our members’ energy, commitment and desire to serve that make this Rotary Club special. I genuinely appreciate the honor of being presented this Paul Harris Fellow award and I want to thank each of you from the bottom of my heart for making Pulaski County a better place to live.”

A member of the club since November 2005, Lowe has served as second vice president, vice president and as president. Lowe annually serves as a presenter for the Choices program for eighth

graders and participates in the Veterans Dayparade and Christmas on the Square. He also has worked with the Science Fair project and taken high school students to Government Day in Jefferson City. Lowe also was the enthusiastic leader of the original Rotary Red Hot Red Hatters, a troupe that helped raise funds for the ASYMCA. He currently serves on the Club Service Committee and headed up the legal team for the club’s Gator raffle.

As president during the 2012-13 year, Lowe spearheaded a PR campaign to increase the local Rotary club’s visibility in the local community and at the District 6080 level. He also started the club’s Fifth Tuesday programming by hosting a club get-together and bonfire at his home on the river. Because of Lowe’s nomination, Wayne Strohschein was chosen for the District Vocational Service Award, earning

additional recognition for the local Rotary Club. With his leadership, the club also furthered its visioning goals and earned a Presidential Citation.

The Paul Harris Society is named after the founder of Rotary International and recognizes individuals who contribute \$1,000 or more to the Rotary Foundation to support activities such as polio eradication, peace and conflict prevention and resolution, disease prevention and treatment, water and sanitation, maternal and child health, basic education and literacy and economic and community development. The club voted in November to donate \$1,000 in Lowe’s honor to Rotary International.

Rotary District Governor Ken Messer bestowed Lowe with a lapel pin from Rotary International and Club President Keith Pritchard presented him with a certificate
