#### Three... Two... One?

With the possible eradication of wild poliovirus type 3, the polio eradication countdown is getting closer than ever to achieving no more cases of polio worldwide. November 14 - On 10 November 2012, an 11-month-old boy from Yobe in northern Nigeria became the last child to be paralyzed by wild polio virus type 3 (WPV3). More than two years on, no other case of the virus has been reported since, anywhere in the world. Experts are becoming quietly more confident that this means global WPV3 transmission may have been interrupted. This would be a historic milestone for the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI), following on from the global eradication of wild poliovirus type 2 (WPV2) in 1999. It would mean that only one wild serotype – wild poliovirus type 1 (WPV1) – is still circulating anywhere in the world.

Two years with no cases of the virus is no guarantee of its eradication, however. One of the key dangers with WPV3 is that it is less virulent than WPV1, causing cases at a rate of approximately 1 in 1,000 infections (compared with 1 in 200 infections with WPV1). While causing fewer cases is a good thing, it also means the virus can transmit silently for longer without being detected. Continued surveillance is necessary before the global eradication of WPV3 can be conclusively determined, with more time being the strongest guarantee that the virus is not circulating without showing itself through cases of paralysis. http://www.polioeradication.org/mediaroom/newsstories

The team will visit eight different cities, will give many Rotary Club presentations and attend the Rotary District 3132 Winter Conference in Goa. Foundation's Endowment Fund in your estate plan. The principal of a gift to the Endowment Fund is never spent, so a portion of the earnings will always be available for Foundation programs.

We invite you to join those who have already committed to improve and enrich the lives of people around the globe through a gift to the Endowment Fund.

The Rotary Foundation is known for its commitment to effective programs that make a real difference in people's lives.

A gift from your estate to the Endowment Fund can provide ongoing financial support for one or more Rotary service areas, as if you were continuing to make annual contributions in perpetuity.

#### How to include the Foundation

You can include Rotary in your estate plans in many ways — most commonly by making a gift in a will or adding to a will by a document known as a codicil. Alternatively, you might choose to make Rotary the beneficiary of a retirement plan or insurance policy. In most cases, your gift should be directed to "The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International." Canadians may use "The Rotary Foundation Canada."

Here are a few examples of language for your adviser to consider:

- For a general gift of a certain percentage or portion of the estate: "I give to The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International one-fourth of my property."
- ◆ For a gift of a specific asset: "I give 500 shares of XYZ stock to The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International."
- ◆ For a contingent bequest, which takes effect only upon the meeting of certain conditions: "In the event my spouse does not survive me, I give to The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International XYZ amount."
- ◆ For a residual bequest, which directs all or a portion of whatever remains after all other required amounts are paid: "I give the rest, residue, and remainder of my estate to The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International."





#### How Rotary programs benefit

Undesignated gifts provide support through the World Fund for Foundation programs with the greatest need. Alternatively, your Rotary district may help direct a portion of the spending from your bequest if you select the SHARE designation. You may also support a specific area of focus. The response form lists the most common options.

#### Naming your fund

You may be able to personalize your legacy through a named fund within the Endowment Fund. The separately identified fund could bear your name, your family's name, or the name of a loved one. The Foundation will work with you and your advisers to prepare a customized testamentary gift agreement memorializing your intent. The minimum amount to establish a fund is US\$25,000.

#### Recognizing your generosity

When you have completed your estate plan, please let Rotary know so we may properly thank you.

Rotary is pleased to confer **Benefactor** status on those who commit any amount in their estate plan to the Endowment Fund. Benefactors receive personalized certificates and a special insignia to wear with their Rotary pins. Those who commit to gifts of US\$10,000 or more receive membership in the **Bequest Society**, which provides special Foundation updates and invitations, and an exclusive pin and engraved crystal.
