Rotary Scholar Report From Jenna Teter Guillen



After a 14-hour flight straight from Los Angeles, California, to Sydney, Australia and another hour flight to the capitol city of Canberra, Sergio (my husband) and I arrived exhausted, but excited to meet several members of the Rotary Club of Woden Daybreak and spend day one in our new home.

Canberra is cold, significantly colder than the rest of the nation, and one of the first things we noticed as the heaters in our new apartment had not been turned on in one month.

The city is similar to Washington D.C. as it is designed with the capitol building in the center and several important national monuments, such as the War Memorial and High Court of Australia (Supreme Court), directly in line, creating a "mall" and a Capitol Hill environment.

The members of the Rotary Club at Woden Daybreak have been most hospitable in helping us adapt to Australia by advising us on the bus system, Aussie dialect and slang, and how to best fit in with the culture.

Although the same language is spoken in Australia, there are significant differences, such as food, meanings of words, and cultural norms. Coffee shops are located on every corner of every street and each carries its own uniqueness. Australians drink coffee religiously, one of my favorite aspects of Australia.

The club ushered me right into involvement as I gave my first presentation on July 24, introducing myself, explaining my studies and what I hope to accomplish in the future.

Several conferences in September and October have already asked me to do a presentation and other clubs in the surrounding areas have reached out with similar requests. I often feel overwhelmed by their desire to hear me speak! It is truly an honor to carry out this opportunity.

My first day of graduate school at the Australian National University was all that I expected and not at the same time. As the only American in the course, often I had to ask for clarification of different legal terms which have entirely different meanings in the U.S. than in Australia.

Because the courses are intensives, meaning they meet all day for three to five days, I was forced to learn the Australian legal and political system instantly. At this point in my studies, much of my time is dedicated to accomplishing the online assessments that are due every week for four weeks after the intensives finish.

Several opportunities have arisen to work alongside law professors in their research, which I am hoping to take full advantage of. My husband, Sergio, is a brave man to come with me to Australia and take a chance on the opportunities here, but it has paid off as he was offered a full-time job with a global technology company called RICOH this week!

All in all, the first month as a Rotary scholar in Australia has been adventurous, but I know more adventure still waits.

Global Scholarship Application Timeline

Rotarians recruit scholarship applicants	March through October 23, 2015
Application deadline	October 23, 2015
Clubs interview applicants and make a recommendation	November 3, 2015
District interviews and selects an applicant	November 14, 2015
Scholarship candidate seeks admission at institution of choice	November 15 through February 2016
District submits candidate's application with letter of admission to the Rotary Foundation for possible approval	No later than March 1, 2016



District 6080 will select one qualified candidate to be recommended to The Rotary Foundation for approval. Once an applicant has been selected by the District Scholarship Committee, he/she will immediately seek admission for graduate study at an institution of choice.

After admission has been obtained, a letter of admission and a proposed course of study must be sent to the Chair of the District Scholarship Committee for submission to The Rotary Foundation, along with the candidate's application for review and possible approval for funding. Please note that funding is not granted until the candidate's scholarship application has been approved by The Rotary Foundation.

That study must focus directly on one or more of the following six focus areas adopted by The Rotary Foundation:

- Peace & Conflict Prevention/Resolution
- Water and Sanitation
- Basic Education and Literacy
- Disease Prevention and Treatment
- Maternal and Child Health
- Economic and Community Development

The Rotary Foundation fully intends these scholarships to have sustainable and high-impact outcomes in these focus areas:

General Scholarship Highlights & Qualifications

- Applicants must complete a Global Grant Scholarship application, which is available at Rotary6080.org, and submit it to a local Rotary Club where he/she has a legal residency or is his/her place of employment or current college enrollment.
- Scholarship study must take place in a foreign country.
- The scholar must be studying within one of the six areas of focus established by the Rotary Foundation (see above).
- The academic program must be at the graduate level.
- The scholar must demonstrate that he/she has already been accepted for study at the desired university abroad before District 6080 can submit the required Global Grant Scholarship application to The Rotary Foundation for consideration.
- The applicant must complete a district authorized Rotary orientation seminar prior to departure for scholarship study.
- The scholar must begin his/her academic program by the approved 2015 academic date.
- The scholar may NOT be (1) a Rotarian; (2) an employee of a club, district or other Rotary entity, or of Rotary International; (3) the spouse, a lineal descendant (child or grandparent by blood) of any person in the foregoing two categories.
- The scholar must live in the immediate vicinity of the approved study institution in the host district so that he/she can participate in the Rotary club and district activities of the home district.
