Great News on eradication efforts:

- Pakistan – 13 cases; last case June 18
- Afghanistan – 6 cases, last case May 29

In Pakistan both the oral polio vaccine and the inactivated (injectable) polio vaccine are being used.

It is required that a report of District Designated Funds (DDF) accounting be provided to the District's Rotarians each year. That report is seen on pages 4 & 5.

In Days of Old, ie. just four years ago, Rotary districts received only 20 percent of their DDF for use in District Simplified Grants. District 6080 usually received \$20,000, which was allotted to 20 clubs receiving \$1,000 each.

With the new Rotary Grants Model, districts may receive 50 percent of their DDF for district-directed use, District Simplified Grants. The attached report shows that \$53,476 was allocated to 25 Rotary clubs, with grants valued between \$500 and \$8,400.

With the SHARE system one-half of Annual Fund giving three years earlier is returned to Rotary Districts. Of special interest, the Mexico Holtz/Beahon Kidney Transplant grant totaled \$107,300 and completed 56 kidney transplants. District 6080 is again this year providing DDF \$'s for kidney transplants, all in the memory of the late District Governor Mike Beahon who died from kidney failure.

Enroll in the District Leadership Academy Class of 2017

In September 2014, District 6080 launched the **District Leadership Academy** program and gave District 6080 Rotarians the opportunity to enroll in this outstanding online leadership program.

Presidents-elect, Presidents Nominee, Past Presidents, Assistant Governors, District Committee Chairs, as well as all club officers and directors and those who aspire to serve as leaders at the club or district level, are encouraged to enroll in the DLA program. The DLA is a 7 1/2 month series of courses in Communications, Membership, Public Image, Youth Services, RI Organization, and The Rotary Foundation. All courses are taught online using the **Canvas Virtual Classroom** Learning Management System. Each course is taught by an experienced Rotarian with extensive knowledge in their specific course topic.

Since District 5110 (*the Academy founding district*) began the program 19 years ago, 12 Rotary districts have adopted the DLA to train their club and district leaders. In all, these districts have graduated more than 1400 Rotarians. As the latest district to adopt the DLA, District 6080 believes that Leadership Academy training will provide our Rotarians with the broadest Rotary background possible, thereby enabling them to be the effective leaders that our clubs and district will need to grow and strengthen Rotary. All interested Rotarians are encouraged to learn more about the DLA and enroll for the Class of 2017. Download DLA information enrollment documents from our District Leadership Academy web site.
