The Rotary Foundation has confirmed year 2015-2016 results

Congratulations and thanks go to the Rotarians of District 6080, the Club officers and to District Governor Steve Dulle for a record-setting year!

1,747 of our Rotarians contributed some amount to The Rotary Foundation (TRF). Of those,

1,389 contributed at least \$100.

On a down note, that means **953** Rotary members gave nothing.

A record \$380,525 was contributed to The Annual Fund, one-half of which will be returned to District 6080 in 2018-2019.

A resulting per capita of \$141 was a new record.

A record **85** Rotarians contributed **\$1,000** or more to The Annual Fund, making them eligible for membership in the Paul Harris Society.

PolioPlus news

The two polio endemic countries continue to have no new cases this past month. Afghanistan continues with six cases this past eight months with the most recent case on May 29; Pakistan continues with 13 cases this past eight months with the most recent case on June 18.

Highlighting the need for continuing immunization is the news that Nigeria recently had two cases of Wild Polio Virus Type 1.

As easily as the Zika virus swept in to America and has infected Missourians, the same can happen with the polio virus. Be sure that your children and grandchildren are vaccinated.

42 of our Rotary clubs elected to give cash contributions to PolioPlus last year. The amount given in cash was \$49,682. District 6080 gave \$30,000 DDF to PolioPlus, this amount was matched .5:1 by TRF before being matched 2:1 by the Gates Foundation. The total contributions from District 6080 after matches by TRF and the Gates Foundation resulted in \$284,046 being made available for the fight to eradicate polio.

District Grants News

District Designated Funds (DDF) are returned to the District as part of the SHARE program wherein Annual Fund contributions collected in year one are invested for three years. Investment earnings pay to support the staff and facilities of TRF.

From the amount contributed to the Annual Fund as much as one-half is returned to our District three years hence. Of that one-half amount, the District may choose to ask for as much as one-half to fund a one-time District Block Grant.

So, Rotarians in 2012-2013 contributed \$300,207 to the Annual Fund. Nearly one-half, or \$148,432, was returned to District 6080 in 2015-2016. To this amount was added earnings of \$829 from District Endowments. District leadership elected to ask for \$74,600 to support projects proposed by clubs which had been contributors in 2012-2013. The Feb. 1, 2016, Foundation Newsletter reported extensively on the 25 Rotary clubs granted a total of \$53,476 which was matched 1:1 by the clubs for a total benefit to their communities of \$106,952. DDF of \$8,622 was directed to District 6080 Scholar Jenna Guillen, who is studying at Australian National University in Canberra, Australia.

The other one-half (\$74,600) is available for contributions to TRF programs such as polioplus or Rotary's Peace Centers or for funding Global Grants, which receive a 1:1 match for DDF used. The Aug. 1, 2016, Foundation Newsletter reported extensively on the use of those funds. PolioPlus was given \$30,000 (that was matched .5:1 by TRF).

The Rotary Club of Jefferson City West had two Global Grants approved. DDF of \$8,000 (TRF 1:1 match) was given for work in a Sierra Leone Orphanage and DDF \$7,000 (TRF 1:1 match) was given for equipping a school in India.

DDF of \$1,000 (same match) was given to equip a school in Mexico.

District Grants News Continued

DDF of \$20,000 was given to the Holtz/Beahon Mexico kidney transplant grant. When matched 1:1, the \$40,000 enabled 15 individuals in Mexico to receive a life-saving kidney transplant, all in the name of the late District Governor Mike Beahon who died needing just such a miracle.

District 6080 funded two Rotary Scholars last year at DDF \$20,000, each which was matched 1:1 by TRF. Emily Voss is studying in the UK and Molly Matney is studying in Ireland, each with a resultant \$40,000 scholarship.

Now Hear This!

From the before mentioned grants, TRF awarded District 6080 \$84,000 from the World Fund.

Think about this: \$84,000 plus the \$148,432 DDF totals \$232,432 or 77.4 percent of the \$300,207 contributed in Annual Funds in 2012-2013. That is well more than the 50 percent most often spoken of.

As Rotary clubs write and have approved Global Grants, our District's total return from TRF may equal or exceed what was initially contributed.

District 6080 will offer one Rotary Global Grant Scholarship in the amount of \$40,000 to a outstanding student who wishes to study abroad during the 2017-18 academic year. This scholarship is for one year only and is open only to students engaged in full-time study in a graduate degree program. Applicants for a Global Scholarship must enroll in a graduate course of study that is directly related to one or more the following six humanitarian focus areas:



- 1. Peace and conflict prevention and/or resolution
- 2. Disease prevention and treatment
- 3. Water and sanitation
- 4. Maternal and child health
- 5. Basic education and literacy
- 6. Economic and community development

Deadline for application submission is October 22, 2016.

General Scholarship Highlights and Qualifications

- Applicants must complete a Global Grant Scholarship application, which is available at Rotary6080.org, and submit it to a local Rotary Club where he/she has a legal residency or is his/her place of employment or current college enrollment.
- The scholar must be studying within one of the six areas of focus established by the Rotary Foundation (see above).
- The academic program must be at the graduate level.
- The scholar should have identified a foreign institution, and program of study, at the time of application; however, it is not necessary for the scholar to apply for admission to the university at the time of application.
- The scholar must begin his/her academic program by the approved 2017 academic date.
- The scholar may NOT be (1) a Rotarian; (2) an employee of a club, district or other Rotary entity, or of Rotary International; (3) the spouse, a lineal descendant (child or grandparent by blood) of any person in the foregoing two categories.
- The scholar must live in the immediate vicinity of the approved study institution in the host district so that he/she can participate in the Rotary club and district activities of the home district.
- Scholarship study must take place in a foreign country.
