

Hello from Dublin! Another month has passed and with it, I have officially finished my second term at Trinity. It's astonishing to imagine that I am already this far along with my year of study here in Ireland. Time has really flown by! Next week, I will participate in a weeklong conflict mediation course, and after that is completed, I will officially be done with courses for my master's program. Of course, that certainly does not mean that my work is done. I am continuing with research for my dissertation, which I anticipate will keep me quite busy in the coming months!

As I mentioned in my previous update, I have had the opportunity to volunteer with the refugee aid organization, City of Sanctuary, over the last month or so. I assisted with the completion of their Politics of Sanctuary course a couple weeks ago and even had the opportunity to attend a ceremony at the conclusion of the course where my academic department, the Irish School of Ecumenics, was recognized by the city of Dublin for their efforts in educating and supporting migrants in Ireland. It was a proud moment to be a part of, as well as encouraging to see the dedication and pride that my professors took in being a part of this amazing program. It certainly made me feel blessed to be studying at such an active and involved institution.

Last week, I also had the opportunity to attend a conference organized by a classmate of mine, which was held on the Trinity campus. The event, which focused on issues of international development in relation to peacebuilding processes, featured speakers from various governmental and non-governmental agencies in Ireland, as well as academics from Trinity, Maynooth University, and the University of Dublin. International development is a topic that I find to be very interesting, and, while it is not considered a main focus of peace studies necessarily, I think that it is intrinsically connected to peace activities and a worthwhile area of study. Not only was this event an excellent networking opportunity, but I was also able to considerably expand my knowledge on issues related to development and conflict. I'm always thankful for additional learning opportunities while I'm here in Dublin!

I continue to stay in close contact with various Rotary representatives here in Ireland, as well. Recently, I was contacted by a member of a Rotary club in Wicklow County, Ireland. They have extended an invitation for me to attend their youth conference on May 8, where I will act as a guest speaker. I am very honored to be able to have this opportunity, and I look forward to sharing my personal experiences as a Rotary scholarship recipient and about Rotary activities in Missouri.
