Success Story of a Rotary Scholar

As Founder of the 'Six Days of Peace,' Gregory Rockson arranged a face-to-face meeting between top Israeli and Palestinian diplomats in Denmark while a Rotary Scholar. He received funding and support from the U.S. Embassy in Denmark, Israeli Embassy and Palestinian Mission in Denmark. He led the first Middle East Partnership program in Denmark with a concert at Tivoli and a special diplomatic event at the Copenhagen City Hall.

Gregory won the District 6080 Rotary Scholarship in 2011 and studied at the University of Copenhagen.

Gregory Rockson is the co-founder and science from Westminster College. He was a Public Policy and International Affairs Fellow (PPIA) from Princeton University, in addition to being a Rotary Scholar at the University of Copenhagen.

mPharma works with drug manufacturers, service providers and third party payers to develop products and services that improve the access and affordability of high quality drugs for patients across the continent.

Africa is home not only to some of the world's poorest countries, but also some of its most expensive medicines. One reason is inefficient supply chains. Each hospital typically buys its own drugs in small and irregular volumes, but erratic inventory-management can leave them with product that expire before use.

"Their job is to provide clinical services, so we stepped in to see how we could centralize procurement services," says Gregory Rockson, cofounder of mPharma, which offers private hospitals and health insurers a chance to save money by buying drug supplies in bulk.

mPharma, which operates in Ghana, Nigeria and Zambia, also offers financing to clinics and collects data on use of the drugs. So far it has concentrated on treatments for diabetes, hypertension and glaucoma. Rockson estimates his organization has reduced medicine costs for about 10,000 patients by an average of 30 percent.

The Rotary club of Fulton, Missouri, submitted Gregory's application and should be rightfully proud of the success of this candidate's work in the world—and all in the last five years.

Your Rotary club is encouraged to seek qualified Rotary Global Scholar candidates for study at an international university in one of Rotary's Six Areas of Focus. The value of the scholarship is \$40,000.
