Rotary Water & Sanitation Month

Rotarians are providing communities with sustainable access to safe water, improved sanitation and hygiene management training. When people, especially children, have access to clean water, improved sanitation facilities and better hygiene habits, they lead healthier and more successful lives.



According to the United Nations, there are still 663 million people around the world who don't have access to clean drinking water.

Where Are We Now?

Since the 1999 inception of Rotary District 6080, the 50 current Rotary clubs have contributed **\$9,430,258** to The Rotary Foundation. One-half of that amount has been returned to our Rotary clubs to 'Do Good in the World' as they see fit. The vast majority of returned funds (District Designated Funds, DDF) has benefited the club's home communities while some clubs have executed grants to help less fortunate people in distant lands. That is as it should be; they are people also, no less benefiting of life, liberty and happiness than we.



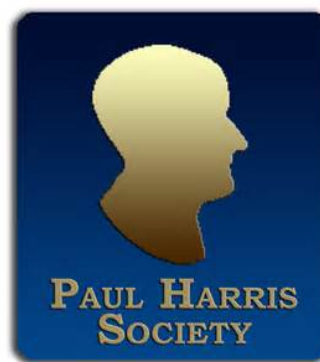
Two Rotary clubs have given more than **\$1million**. They are **Springfield Southeast** and **Warrensburg**. Three Rotary clubs have given more than **\$500,000**. They are **Columbia**, **Columbia South**, and **Jefferson City**. Where Are We Now?

Every Rotarian Every Year in District 6080 to date:

- 1,194 of our 2,646 Rotarians (45 percent) have contributed to The Rotary Foundation.
- 827 of our 2,646 Rotarians (31 percent) have contributed at the Sustaining level of \$100 or more.
- 38 of our Rotarians (1 percent) have contributed at the Paul Harris Society level of \$1,000 or more.



All-time giving by Rotarians in District 6080:

- 4,616 Paul Harris Fellows, those Rotarians who have contributed \$1,000 or had that amount given to The Rotary Foundation in their name
- 81 members of the Bequest Society, those Rotarians who have made estate plans of \$10,000 or more to The Rotary Foundation
- 61 Major Donors, those Rotarians who have cumulatively contributed \$10,000 or more to either the Annual Fund or PolioPlus
- Six Rotarians have established named Endowments beginning with a contribution of \$25,000 or more. Today's value of those Endowments is \$549,823. The good work of these Rotarians will go on into perpetuity.

Foundation receives highest rating from Charity Navigator

For the 10th consecutive year, The Rotary Foundation has received the highest rating — four stars — from Charity Navigator, an independent evaluator of charities in the United States.

In the most recent ratings, [the Foundation earned the maximum of 100 points](#) for demonstrating both strong financial health and commitment to accountability and transparency.

Polio Eradication Headlines



February 23 marked 64 years since the first large-scale trial of inactivated polio vaccine (IPV). Developed by Joseph Salk, IPV was found to be safe and effective, and is now part of the routine vaccination programs worldwide. Each year, it confers lifelong protection against polio to millions of young children.

The Truth of the Matter

For every case of paralytic polio, there are an estimated 100 additional individuals in the neighborhood who are infected with polio, are asymptomatic and are daily shedding infectious polio virus in their feces. The virus ends up in open sewers in villages where children play with balls recovered from the water, and where they play in the water.

Polio Eradication Headlines



A large part of the polio eradication effort now centers on environmental testing. Where polio virus is found in the environment, the opportunity for infection of individuals exists.

So, Afghanistan had three new wild polio virus 1 positive environmental samples last week. Pakistan had four new wild polio virus 1 samples from three different areas last week.



The modified-live-virus oral polio vaccines pictured here will soon be phased out, in favor of the injectable killed vaccine.
