# News from a Beloved 6080 Rotarian

Dr. Trish Blair, Columbia South Rotarian and primary contact of the District's first VTT Global Grant to the country of Georgia in the amount of \$120,000, is requesting help.

In August 2008 our District quickly raised and wired \$25,000 for emergency medical supplies when she was behind the lines during the Russian invasion of South Ossetia, Georgia, treating both injured Russian soldiers and injured and dying young and old Georgians. Trish is a trained, skilled trauma surgeon.

She writes that her cancer has recently reoccurred. She is again on a cycle of different chemotherapy with unpleasant side effects, including intense fatigue. She asks for prayers and 'happy' cards mailed to her address: 106 W. Burnam Rd., Columbia, MO 65205.

Trish has maintained a Rotary booth in the House of Friendship at North American Rotary International conventions for years and has been granted Booth 1123 at the RI convention in Toronto June 23-27.

# Polio News



Two polio vaccinators — a mother-daughter team — were killed in Pakistan on Jan. 22, 2018, the first time in two years that the polio eradication drive had been shaken by assassinations. The vaccinators, a 38-year-old woman and her 16-year-old daughter, were each shot in the head by motorcycle-riding assassins, the Pakistani authorities said.

Scores of people have been killed in recent years in militant attacks on polio immunization campaigns. In January 2015 a suicide bombing in Quetta killed 15 people outside a vaccination center in Quetta.

Last year, Pakistan <u>had only eight</u> <u>confirmed cases</u> of polio paralysis; four years ago, the nation had 306. The only other country with continuing transmission of polio <u>is Afghanistan</u>, <u>which had 14 cases last year</u>, most of them in provinces adjoining Pakistan and among Pashtuns, the predominant ethnic group in border areas.

The two countries <u>now coordinate their</u> <u>national vaccination days</u>, in which more than 200,000 part-time canvassers in Pakistan and <u>40,000 in Afghanistan</u> try to give vaccine drops to every child under 5.

We are asked to give \$20 each year toward polio eradication efforts. Will you honor the 16-year-old and her mother who died so violently by making a contribution?

Rotary's contributions to the polio eradication effort account for nearly 11 percent of all contributions through December 2016 and approximately 42 percent of private sector giving.
