## Former RI President Ray Klinginsmith Dies



Ray Klinginsmith of Kirksville, president of Rotary International in 2010-11, died Jan. 17. He was 86.

Ray worked as an attorney in Macon and Kirksville for many years. He also served as the general counsel, dean of administration and a professor of business administration at Truman State University, retiring in 1995, after 22 years.

After a year as a Rotary scholar at the University of Cape Town in 1961, Ray joined Unionville Rotary when he returned. He was president of the Macon Rotary Club in 1970-71 and governor of Rotary District 605 in 1975-76 after moving to Kirksville.

He then served on the Rotary International (RI) Board of Directors in 1985-87, as the moderator for the International Assembly in 1989, and as a Trustee for The Rotary Foundation in 2002-06. He was vice chairman for the 2005 RI Convention and chairman for the 2008 RI Convention. In 2008, he was selected as the RI President for 2010-11, and he and his wife

moved to Evanston, Illinois, for the two years that he served as the President Elect and President.

Ray is acknowledged as the "godfather" of the Show Me Rotary Council, which plans and administers the Presidents-Elect Training Seminar (PETS) each year. It was his plan in 1982 that established a 24-member council with representatives from each district, and he served as the first president.

A recipient of The Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and its Distinguished Service Award, Ray and his late wife, Judie, were Major Donors to The Rotary Foundation. The Kirksville Rotary Club honored him by creating the Ray Klinginsmith Distinguished Service Award in 2007. The amphitheater in Kirksville's Rotary Park is named for him.

Ray was a director of Macon-Atlanta State Bank for over 36 years as well as an Adair County commissioner from 2001 to 2004. Ray and Judie founded the Chariton Valley Association for Handicapped Citizens in 1982. Due to his work with CVA, Ray was accorded the 1988 Parent/Caretaker Award by the Missouri Planning Council for Developmental Disabilities, and he served as one of the initial trustees for the Missouri Family Trust, which was created by the Missouri legislature in 1989.

He also was active in the Boy Scouts as an adult leader and was awarded the Silver Beaver award by the Great Rivers Council. He was accorded the Thomas D. Cochran Community Award by the Young Lawyers Section of The Missouri Bar in 1983, and he was named as a Man of Distinction by the Theta Xi National Fraternity in 2018.

A graduate of the University of Missouri, where he earned both bachelor of arts and bachelor of science degrees in 1959 and a juris doctorate in 1965, he was a recipient of the 2023 Faculty and Alumni Award from the Mizzou Alumni Association.

Per his wishes, there will be no funeral service. A celebration of life event will be held from 4 to 7 p.m. Feb. 10 at DuKum Inn, 111 S. Elson St., Kirksville. Attendees are encouraged to wear apparel that represents their connection to Ray (Putnam County, Truman State, Mizzou, Rotary, CVA, Kansas City Chiefs, etc.).

(books can be donated to schools, libraries, etc.)


Volunteer reading — each hour = 10 points (read to children, elderly or anyone; for adult literacy, etc.)

## Camdenton Rotarian Celebrates 104th Birthday

Grant Richards joined the Rotary Club of Camdenton in 1945 and didn't miss a meeting for 78 years. Even after he moved to Kansas City to live with his daughter, he Zoomed in to the meetings in his old club.

This dedicated Rotarian turned 104 on Jan. 30. He has moved back to the Lake area and is now living at StoneBridge Care Center in Osage Beach.

To celebrate the birthday, the family asked for a card shower.

"He was so surprised by all the cards. He had a good birthday with some old friends stopping by with birthday wishes," Susan Bredeman, his

daughter, said. "Rotary has been such a meaningful part of his life and the support that came from various clubs shows what a significant contribution Rotary makes in people's lives."

The Richards family relocated to Camdenton in 1937 from Michigan. They founded the Reveille newspaper, later known as the Lake Sun. Grant's father, G. T. Richards, began the Camdenton Rotary Club with a friend in 1937.

Grant enlisted in the U.S. Navy and was away for a few years before returning to the Camdenton area to join the family business. When he got back, he joined Rotary on June 24, 1945. For years his life revolved around his family, the family newspaper and Rotary.

He remained an active member for nearly eight decades without missing a meeting until Oct. 21, 2023. If he had to be out of town for any reason, he was sure to make it up by attending a meeting at another area Rotary Club.



"My dad had perfect attendance till he died. That was 43 years," recalled Richards. "I used to always

tell him, 'I can beat your record 'cause I'm younger.' It became a habit," he said.

And beat the record he did.

"I really want to get him some national attention," Jeff Vernetti, Camdenton Rotary president, said. "This has to be some sort of an amazing record and the Rotary world should know."

Springfield Sunrise Rotary's first two meetings of the year were offsite of their normal meeting location. On Jan. 3, they met at Jordan Valley Ice Park.




Their second offsite meeting was at Mother's Brewing Company on Jan. 10.




# Join the Fulton Rotary Club & Former St. Louis Cardinal Charlie James
